Camp Lucky: Summer of Carnage

Camp Lucky: Summer of Camage, part exhibition and part artistic reference to youth (PARTY) will exist for one night (with the exhibition continuing the week thereafter) all under the curatorial control of emerging Super Pop artist, Paul Horn. Based on an artistic fictional narrative. orchestrated in the mind of the curator, about a group of fun loving artists invited to a classic Hollywood B-Rated summer camp where story line and characters are paper thin in the weakest form of reality. Within this context. Paul Horn exploits Hollywood's veil. Artists participating in this exhibition explore the suggestion of the inherent duality contained in the contemporary American Dream.

Beginning in 2000, Paul Hom has curated four art exhibitions in the Houston area. Hom's exhibitions include wide varieties of media from installation to performance controlled by a contorted Pop environment. Horn carefully orchestrates exhibitions that contextualize artwork in non-traditional exhibition environments meant to enhance the viewing experience. Using venues from a Holiday Inn to an elevator carriage, he has not only made the art a focal point but questions the way we view the work as well. He continues to question the role of artist as curator and finds new and interesting ways to contextualize work by a range of established and upcoming artists.

Work ranges from the biomorphic designs of Sharon Engelstein, Mark Floods' lace paintings, and Aaron Parazette's seamless word configurations. Anthony Liberto and Scott Burns present their dreamscapes in watercolor. Aimee Jones, Teresa O'Connor and Jenny Schlief have created Hollywood-esque landscape installations. Rachel Hecker's tightly executed airbrushed compositions will compliment the light sculpture of the notoriously commentary ridden duo, The Art Guys.
