

If your thirst for cartoon art wasn't satiated by last night's Felici show, head to the Deborah Colton Gallery for "New Cartoon!" — a mixed-media show

featuring artists who use cartoons and illustrations to explore the social complexities of our oft-insane American society. The show includes works by Ai Kijima, who uses discarded fabrics to create retro cartoons, iconic illustrations and patterns. Artist collective Paper Rad (Jessica Ciocci, Jacob Ciocci and Benjamin Jones) will exhibit a video work of animation and works on paper. Cory Archangel will showcase hacked-open Nintendo game cartridges. And there's even some kinky cartoon action, with Texas artist Andy Coolquitt's plywood cutout animal figures positioned into freaky sexual encounters, which serve as a tongue-in-cheek commentary on what we deem "proper behavior." Papercity JANUARY t's a stellar start for the year, beginning with contempo blockbusters at the major museums. Blaffer Gallery mount "Jane and Louise Wilson: Erewhon" (January 1.5 - March 6) featuring brooding videos by these British-born twins, who explore the psychological drama of architecture (think abandoned hospitals and defunct mining facilities New Zealand) ... Rice Gallery also steps up to video, bringing to town Eve Sussman's 89 Seconds at Alcázo a poetic work most recently seen at the Whitney Biennial, based on Velásquez's 17th-century masterpiece Las Menin (January 20 - February 27) ... Contemporary African art is red hot at the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston, The Menil Collection and the Contemporary Arts Museum Houston. Don't miss Bodys Kingelez's sculptures of idealized future cities at the CAMH (January 28 - May 1) or the concurrently running "African Art Now: Masterpieces from the Jean Pigozzi Collection" at the MFAH and Romuald Rosanne Olson's Sunning Herself at Hazoumé's compelling assemblages that warn against all forms of Watermark Fine Art Photographs and Books slavery at the Menil (January 29 - May 8) ... Houston painter David McGee is in the limelight, both as curator for "Deep Wells and Reflecting Pools" (January 21 - April 17) at the Menil (McGee culls artworks and ephemera from the museum's troves that investigate racial inequality) and artist, featured in the eagerly awaited "Double Consciousness: Black Conceptual Art Since 1970" (January 22 – April 17), curated by the always insightful Valerie Cassel Oliver at CAMH ... Project Row Houses' founder Rick Lowe solos at the Glassell School of Art January 20 -March 6) ... Top gallery picks: ever wacky, wondrous Paul Horn at Texas Gallery (January 18 - February 12), highlighting this cool pop-meister's collages; Tommy Fitzpatrick's sublime architectural views at Inman Gallery (January 14 – February 19); Melanie Crader's fashion-forward minimalism at Gallery Sonja Roesch (January 8 - February 26); Seattle-based lenswoman Rosanne Olson's witty take on identity issues at Watermark Fine Art Photographs and Books, (January 8 -February 5); Karin Broker's hypnotic assemblages at McClain Gallery (opening January 8); Randy Twaddle's exquisite text-based drawings at Moody Gallery (January 8 – February 5); and "New Cartoon!" at Deborah Colton Gallery (January 22 – March 6), including works by Ultra Violet, one of the stars of Andy Warhol's Factory)...
