Dallas' Hotel ZaZa has a special new guest: an eclectic art series curated by gallerist Deborah Colton.

Stay ZaZa Art House and Social Gallery, an event space and pop-up hot spot, is gearing up to give the Design District a little artsy competition. Houston Art Fair chairperson Deborah Colton has teamed up with Hotel ZaZa owner Charlie Givens and President Benji Homsey to develop a series of exhibitions featuring cutting-edge pieces in a variety of mediums from both established and emerging talent. First up is Jonas Mekas, known in the cultural circuit as the "godfather of independent

film," whose projections and framed photographs of such icons as Jackie Kennedy and Andy Warhol will be on display from Oct. 22 through the holidays. Following Mekas will be work from Russian photographer Oleg Dou and master painter Lowell Boyers—and a lucky Dallas artist (currently unknown) to be added to the roster in 2015.
