## **Stephen Torton**

Painting, Sculpture and Tricher Collé

**Deborah Colton Gallery** is pleased to present, Painting, Sculpture and Tricher Collé by interdisciplinary artist Stephen Torton; an evocative exploration of the personal journey which addresses notions of history, the search for place and the role of creation and its relationship to the collective.

Using classical and time-honored techniques of incrustation; a style of classical Roman mural decoration which employs layers of pigments with deliberately placed textural elements and Florentine stucco, Torton integrates "tricher collé" the "trick that sticks". This is a phrase created by the artist to describe his use of decomposed and metamorphosed photographic "skins" as a visceral and historical recording of experience. Much of Torton's work was born in a casual, playful atmosphere of experimentation while working on mural commissions. In the tradition of Albers, Torton's paintings are frequently developed upon a foundation of the chromatic interactions of color studies often using broken mosaic fragments of his own work. The result is subtle, introspective, mysterious and evocative of ancient symbolism, hieroglyphs and abstract, fetishistic representations of myth and deity. For Torton the intersection of life and art are integral. His approach to both is prolific and fervent.

Stephen Torton is an interdisciplinary artist and master artisan. He was born in 1957 in Brooklyn and currently works in Paris, New York and Brazil. International exhibitions include Paris Photo, Galerie du Jour Agnes b., Centro de Arte Contemporaneo Wilfredo Lam at the 7th Bienal de la Habana (Cuba), the Fondation Dina Vierny-Musee Maillol, (Paris), Galerie Mitterand (Geneva) and Galerie Enrico Navarra (Paris). He is in many public and private collections including Enrico Navarra, Agnes b., Musee Maillol, Leo Malca, Johnny Depp, Fanny Ardent, J.G. and Edward Mitterand, David Broillet and Bernardo Paz at Inhotim Centro de Art, Brazil.

Deborah Colton Gallery is founded on being an innovative showcase for ongoing presentation and promotion of strong historical and visionary contemporary artists world-wide, whose diverse practices include painting, works on paper, sculpture, video, photography, and conceptual and future media installations.
