The Annual Benefit for the Dominic Walsh Dance Theater on May 2nd was created in a new and exciting way this year and achieved great success, with higher auction results than other years before and exceeding fundraising objectives for the event. Their Empire State of Mind artful fundraiser, cochaired by Deborah M. Colton and Mady Kades, packed Deborah Colton Gallery with more than 130 patrons, new and old. The Benefit helped raise over \$75,000 to support the company's upcoming trip to the prestigious Joyce Theater in Manhattan.
